10-year CTI-CFF Regional Plan of Action (RPOA)

Leaders Summit 2009 agreed to adopt 10-year CTI-CFF Regional Plan of Action (CTI-CFF RPOA), a document to conserve and sustainably manage coastal and marine resources with five (5) goals and to establish Regional Secretariat to service the ongoing implementation process.



5 Goals of CTI-CFF Regional Plan of Action (RPOA)

- 1. Priority **Seascapes** designated and effectively managed
- 2. Ecosystem Approach to Management of Fisheries (EAFM) and other marine resources fully applied
- 3. Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) established and effectively managed
- 4. Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) measures achieved
- 5. Threatened Species status improving

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between THE CORAL TRIANGLE INITIATIVE ON CORAL REEFS, FISHERIES AND FOOD SECURITY (CTI CFF) And THE SOUTHEAST ASIAN FISHERIES DEVELOPMENT CENTER (SEAFDEC)

PREAMBLE

Recognizing the mutual benefits that could be gained through enhanced cooperation, the Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center (hereinafter referred as "SEAFDEC") and the Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security (hereinafter referred to as "CTI CFF"), agreed to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to formalize relevant collaborative efforts in fostering Research and Development (R&D) in fisheries in the countries around the Coral Triangle that comprise the CTI CFF-SEAFDEC partnership.








RS CTI-CFF ORGANIGRAM 2015 (CURRENT)
